## Information for your business

This edition of Energy Notes includes information about your monthly bill, including an overview of the charges for your electricity and programs we offer to help you make your bill even lower. You can always get the latest information about your bill online, including how to read your statement and an explanation of all the bill components.

YOUR RATES AND CHARGES

The Florida Public Service Commission sets base rates and other charges on your bill. Business rate classification is based on your maximum monthly electrical usage and when you use electricity. Qualifying for another rate may produce savings for some customers. For example, with time-of-use rates, you are billed at a lower rate for off-peak usage and a higher rate for peak-period usage. To benefit, you must shift electrical use from the following peak hours, Monday through Friday:
»April 1 to Oct. 31, noon to 9 p.m.*
» Nov. 1 to March 31, 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. to 10 p.m.*

## Resale of electric service prohibited

The Florida Administrative Code prohibits the resale of electricity for profit. The actual cost of electricity billed by FPL may be reasonably allocated among tenants, lessees and other entities as long as no profit is made.

## Gross receipts tax

FPL pays 2.5 percent of gross electric revenues to the state in the form of a gross receipts tax. This tax appears as a separate line item on your bill.


## Earn A+ in savings with efficiency upgrades

You can cool your business more efficiently and lower energy costs just like Charlotte County Public Schools. This school district used FPL rebates to install energy recovery ventilation systems, which use energy from a building's exhaust airflows to pre-cool outside air before it's processed by the A/C.
